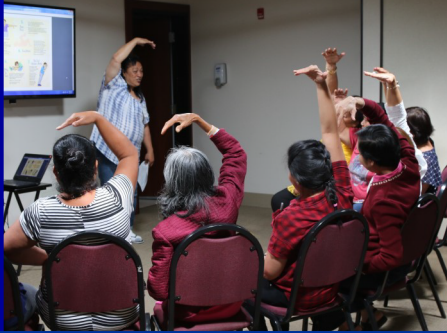

A Community Health Worker (CHW) is a trusted member of the community, and a valuable part of a healthcare or social services team. Also known as outreach workers or navigators, CHWs provide health education and care coordination. They help others take action and promote healthy communities.

You can complete a Community Health Worker Certificate of Competence, part time in one academic year. The certificate requires 16 credits.
